Dear Con Edison Customer:

In February, Con Edison plans to begin installing a new transmission line that will significantly upgrade the electricity facilities that serve your area. When completed, this transmission line, called M29, will allow Con Edison to meet the growing demand for electricity and enhance reliability.

In August 2007, the New York State Public Service Commission approved Con Edison's application to construct the M29 transmission line. The M29 will be 9½ miles long, connecting the Sprain Brook substation in Yonkers with a new switching station under construction in upper Manhattan. Most of the M29 will be installed underground, mainly along public roadways. The project is scheduled for completion in 2010.

The M29 will be constructed through open trenches. This will require digging up and resurfacing street pavement in segments. Con Edison will make every effort to expedite the work and minimize noise, fumes, and dust. Special consideration will be given to community-sensitive areas such as schools and parks.
