## Understanding RNY Accounts & ICAP Tags

Customers enrolled in the Recharge New York (RNY) program are assigned two account numbers by Con Edison in addition to their main account number. Con Edison establishes these companion accounts solely for the purpose of billing the customer's corresponding RNY usage allocation.

- Each companion account represents 50% of the NYPA hydropower allocation and 50% of either the NYPA market power procurement or customer-arranged market power purchase allocation.
- The main account is used to bill any usage in excess of the RNY allocation.

Customers participating in the RNY program and choosing to enroll with an ESCO should provide the ESCO with the main account number. The main account number is what the ESCO will use to submit an enrollment request.

- If the service address is followed by "NYPA" or "ESCO" and the billing history in RAIS shows a fixed demand use, it is an indication this is a companion account for a customer participating in RNY.

In RAIS, the main account number provides the total ICAP that an ESCO will be responsible for, regardless of whether NYPA has 100% or 50% of the RNY allocation.

ICAP tags shown in RAIS are correct. ICAP tags are calculated once each year based on that account's usage at the time of the NYCA Coincident Peak Day and Hour.
