

Con Edison Light Duty Make Ready Program: Disadvantaged Communities

The map below shows New York State “Disadvantaged Community” (DAC) areas, shaded in gray, where public fast-charging stations and level 2 stations in multi-family buildings are eligible for higher incentives in Con Edison’s Light-Duty Make Ready Program.

If the site you are considering is not clearly within the gray areas, you can do an address search by logging into Con Edison’s Hosting Capacity [portal](#) and viewing our EV Load Capacity map, which has these areas as a layer.

About the Data

Disadvantaged Communities in the Make-Ready Program are defined as areas that meet either of the two criteria listed below:

1. Census block groups that meet the LMI Area Threshold (see below), that are also located within the DEC Potential Environmental Justice Areas
2. New York State [Opportunity Zones](#)

LMI Area Threshold: Top quartile of census block groups in New York, ranked by the percentage of LMI Households in each census block. For the purposes of the Make-Ready Program, LMI Households are defined as households with annual incomes at or below 50% of the Area Median Income of their Census block group.

The Area Median Income data source is 2011-2015 HUD estimates, found here:
